Games and Sports

P.G. College Dwarahat is known for promoting sports and games among the student youth. College offers sports facilities in games such as Badminton, Cricket, Foot-ball, Athletics etc. College offers special concessions and relaxation in admissions to outstanding sports persons.

Annual games are organized in the college. selected students further play intercollegiate and inter University Sports events every year. Annual games and sports functions are organized in the college. A sportsperson may participate in up to three competitions. The best sportsperson is nominated champion every year in both categories i.e. male and female.

National Cadet Corps (NCC) *CTO/ANO*: Dr. Darshan Singh

NCC started from 12 August, 2008 in P.G. College Dwarahat, which offers activities to stimulate interest and create a sense of participation in matters of National Defence. The content of NCC course includes basic training in Drill and ceremonials, field craft, Map reading and navigation, the use and handling of infantry weapons and the element of military organisation etc. Attachment to Military units are arranged for first hand experience and training camps are held annually in various parts of India for selected cadets. Apart from the normal NCC training, we also offers membership for NCC cadets in various club activities like Rifle shooting, trekking and self defense techniques etc. These facilities are available to cadets free of charge.

ACTIVITIES

Various camps which are organized for the cadets are as follows:

COMBINED ANNUAL TRAINING CAMP (CATC)

The chief aim of Annual Training camps is to impart collective training to the cadets with special emphasis on the development of qualities of leadership and military skills. Participation in these camps is an essential requirement for appearing at `A`, `B`, and `C` certificate examination.

NATIONAL INTEGRATION CAMP (NIC)

This camp is organised by NCC Directorate with the aim to develop the spirit of National Integration among the NCC cadets. REPUBLIC DAY CAMP (RDC)

This camp is organised by DG NCC at the time of Republic day celebrations of the country. It is held from 9th to 29th January every year in Delhi. In this camp selected cadets from all over the country take part. National Service Scheme

NSS was formally launched on 24th September, 1969-the birth centenary year of the Father of the nation. Therefore, 24th September is celebrated every year as NSS Day with appropriate programmes and activities.

In pursuance of the National Scheme to inculcate feeling of service towards nation and understanding of national priorities amongst youth a vision of National Service Scheme came in to existence.

While NSS was started in the college from the year 1987-88, with one unit of 50 students. But now college has two units of 100 each. The overall aim of National Service Scheme is to give an extension to the higher education system and orient the student youth to community service while they are studying in educational institutions. The reason for the formulation of this objective is the general realization that the college and +2 level students have a tendency to get alienated from the village/slums which constitute the majority for the population of the country. The educated youth who are expected to take the reins of administration in future are found to be unaware of the problems of the village/slum community and in certain cases it is necessary to arouse the social conscience of the students, and to provide them an opportunity to work with the people in the villages and slums. It is felt that their interaction with the common realities of life and bring about a change in their social perception.

Develop a sense of social and civic responsibility among students.
